NESTING BOX TIPS

- 1. Take the time to choose the right box for the species you want to attract; a blue tit box is different from a robin box, which is certainly different to a barn owl box.
- 2. Ensure the box is at a suitable height to deter most predators but allow you easy access for cleaning.
- 3. If possible, avoid facing boxes south, as they can warm up in the afternoon sun and overheat any chicks inside. Boxes facing the prevailing wind are also less desirable.
- 4. If you are making your own box, use FSC sustainably-sourced wood, or purchased tough woodcrete boxes with a long lifespan that can thermo-regulate in all weathers, and deter the most ardent predators. They must also be weather-proof.
- 5. Ensure the entrance hole is a good height above the nesting area (at leasts 10cms/4 inches for small boxes) and don't forget a blue tit can build a nest several centimetres thick.
